003 OPENS WORK SESSION ON HB 3283.

005 DAN JARMAN, Committee Administrator: Summarizes House and Senate
amendments for the Conference Committee.
-Refers to testimony submitted by the State Police. Exhibit A.

030 MOTION: CHAIR LUNDQUIST: Moves the ADOPTION of the -C6 amendments
dated 6/5/95. Exhibit B.

034 JACK ROBERTS, Commissioner, Bureau of Labor and Industries: Summarizes
-C6 amendments.

046 -In response to Sen. Kennemer: Yes, the -C5 (Exhibit C) are included in
the -C6.

-Continues with testimony, specifically refers to the repealing of the
consumer and electronic industry regulation as was in the House bill.

128 SEN. DERFLER: Expresses that he would like Mr. Meyers to testify on the
bill.

133 CARL MEYERS, State Court Reporters, Repair Industry: Apologizes to the
House members for not putting on a good case in the House.

-Refers to previous letters from manufacturers and others in support of
