Opens WORK SESSION on SB -
334

03 Chair Kintigh: Meeting called to order 1:10 PM.
10 Bruce McIntosh: Committee Administrator. Reviews the amendments for
SB -279.
 See staff measure summary, exhibit A.
25 Sen. Bradbury: Asks for clarification of amendment one.
61 Mike Propes: Polk County Commissioner. Clarifies the questions raised by
Sen.
Bradbury
 regarding farming vs. the non-farm dwellings.
80 Sen. Hartung: How do they qualify to build a home on their own property?
90 Propes: Explains the original intent of the bill and the processing
requirements for
 qualification

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110 Sen. Hartung: Questions the required qualifications for placing a home
and what dollar amount is needed to do this.

125 Sen. Bradbury: Asks that the second amendment be clarified by McIntosh.

133 McIntosh: Clarifies said amendment and how it differs from the first
one.

161 Ted Molinari: Bill requester. Gives a brief explanation of the qualification process for this bill as it was originally written, and now with the amendments before the committee.

179 Sen. Bradbury: Requests additional examples and clarification for home placement.

210 Sen. Bradbury: Is it possible to qualify for habitat only?

257 Molinari: Yes, only if it is a "non-farm" dwelling.

297 Propes: We have tried to rewrite this program to stop possible corruption. But there will always be someone who finds an "out."

321 Sen. Hartung: Wishes to table SB -334 until further research.

Closes PUBLIC HEARING on SB -334

Opens WORK SESSION on SB -334

340 MOTION: SEN. HARTUNG: Moves to ADOPT SB -334 dash-1 AMENDMENTS.

VOTE: Hearing no objections the amendment is ADOPTED. 50. MOTION PASSES Sen. Dwyer was excused.

415 MOTION: SEN. JOHNSON: Moves SB 334 AS AMENDED TO THE FLOOR with a DO PASS recommendation.

VOTE: 5-0. MOTION PASSES Sen. Dwyer is excused.

420 Sen. Hartung: Recommends Sen. Derfler carry this item.

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Tape 37A.

17 Chair Kintigh: Will speak with Sen. Derfler to confirm. Introductions of new bill. Reads the introduction of LC-3558. With no objections to this bill it is entered as a committee bill.

Opens PUBLIC HEARING on SB -279

25 Chris Durth: Representative from the Governor. The governor is comfortable with the bill except the dash-1 amendment.

35 Sen. Johnson: Thanks Durth for his time.

45 Ken Yates: NWFPC. The dash-1 amendment points out that the federal and state governments do not differentiate between food and drink. Drink is food. The OFPC would like to show support to the dash-5 amendment.

70 Sen. Johnson: Discusses the amendment and that it needs more definition.

96 Sen. Bradbury: More than willing to better define his amendment regarding the incorporation or deletion of "drink."

118 Sen. Johnson: Requests that the statute be included in the dash-1

amendment.

120 Sen. Shannon: You support the dash-5 and not the dash-1 even if amended?

122 Yates: Yes, we support the dash-5 amendment. However, NWFPC is opposed

the

dash-1 amendment.

137 Sen. Johnson: Asks Sen. Bradbury if the dash-5 amendment is O.K. with

him.

141 Sen. Bradbury: Yes. We have shown as a State that Oregon is trying to keep the recycling

rate up. Items like milk jugs that are not subject to the bottle bill, are being shown that there is

a demand for the resin and the recycling of those containers.

165 Chair Kintigh: Believes the recycling rate will not fall off if we pass this bill.

169 Sen. Bradbury: "Did we ever need this bill at all?" I would still argue, that we do need

the bill.
