The -5 amendments alleviate the concerns SEN. DERFLER had on indigent defense and SEN. DUKES had on whether someone should know that someone is going to be consuming alcohol at some point in the future.

054 REP. KEN STROHB ECK, District 6: Explains the -5 amendments. We do need the combination of the previous -A4 and the -5 amendments by Emily Cedarleaf.

--dismissal of citations not mailed within 30 days;
--dismissal of citations not mailed within six months;
--refers to necessity of charging fines to credit cards within a short
time;
--rental car agencies;
--Judge Abraham fully supports.

098 CHAIR: Asks if it is okay if we have a separate standard for rental
cars.

GARDNER: Explains credit card requirements and valid charges established
by this.

115 BRAD SWANK, State Court Administrators Office: Addresses the -7
amendments and major fiscal impact. Refers
to:
--requirements for additional notices over what they send out now;
--potential loss will be substantially reduced;
--additional employee in shop.

131 SEN. DERFLER: Questions accuracy of fiscal impact.

CHAIR: It is immensely wrong due to the amendments.

SWANK: That is one major reason we are making these amendments; so that we
can avoid that fiscal impact.

137 CHAIR: Asks SWANK to expedite fiscal and revenue studies because of
time constraints.
