060 Paulus -provides history of the Common School Fund in Oregon -speaks about proposed amendments to HJR 15A, and concern with future legislative oversight of management and accountability of funds through the Oregon Community Foundation -discussion about OCF grant process, distribution authority, and grant-in-aid projects 240 -Chancellor of the Oregon University and College System Joseph Cox -expresses support for education endowment concept which addresses the long term future of children's education and state's economy 275 -"educational and economic investment is one and the same" -discussion of enabling legislation HB 2491, scholarship administration of public funds, and student need grants TAPE 034 SIDE A 010 Robert L. Rose -Confederation of Oregon School Administrators -expresses difficulties in saving money toward the future when faced with current financial needs Rose -will actively support passing the measure in May, but sees this 035 bill as a small step in terms of large issues 040 John Danielson -Oregon Education Association -comments that the bill "appears to be a good concept" and does not see it as competing with other financial issues -pursuant to board meeting next week, expects that staff recommendation will be to support proposal John Marshall -Oregon School Boards Association 057 -comments about legislative work on school fund appropriation and distribution, surplus kicker, and income tax cuts which seem focused on giving money away rather than meeting current needs in next two years -states that this bill is worthy idea, and suggests it is appropriate to use existing state agencies for education endowment distribution rather than relying on the Community Education Foundation -points out that state agencies have oversight from State Audits Division -pledges membership support if measure is on May ballot -discussion about the measure not affecting this session's budget cycle, and impact on future budgets -suggests that future decisions will need to be made about 104 Danielson raising taxes or reducing/cutting some government services 126 Sen.
