190 PHILLIPS: We consider this a reflection of status quo. The language clarifies original intent.

230 PHILLIPS: Gives definition of public employee entitled to indemnity protection.
262 - Our faculty perform teaching and research responsibilities that

private physicians do not.

290 CHAIR BRYANT: Does this give an unfair competitive advantage to physicians who operate under this umbrella compared to physicians in the community who aren't under it?

304 PHILLIPS: We don't believe that, as our physicians have additional responsibilities beyond physician patient responsibility. Providing liability insurance is a condition of employment.

324 CHAIR BRYANT: This effects how many? 500?

324 PHILLIPS: It extends to all of our faculty. Full time faculty is approaching 500.
