GAY FIELDS, Oregon Association of County Clerks: Could be busy every weekend. Explains.

CHAIR BRYANT: Might there be some public relations problems by charging

for your staff's time in acting as witnesses?

FIELDS: I do not charge for use of staff. Explains.

MAX WILLIAMS: Speaks of conversation with Deschutes County Clerk. Indicated in 70% of weddings performed, she has to pull people off the counter to act as witnesses.

SEN. BAKER: Who is the fee paid to?

FIELDS: Fee is paid to the county.

MAX WILLIAMS: The SB 1060-1 amendments delete changes in the bill which

would have changed the way a church or minister files evidence of authority

to solemnize marriages. Explains.
