Derfler, explains that Proposed (-12) Amendments to HB 3349B are intended to "keep the firefighter and the police in the same relative position as PERS retirees if the bill passes" -discussion and questions 047 Mark Gibson -Governor's Office, Policy Advisor for Health Care and Human

Resources and Labor -expresses Governor's support for bill with no amendment from its current form as it pertains to sick leave issues and or to the linkage of benefit rates to tax rates 060 -comments on expected ruling from the Supreme Court in time for anticipated special session -in response to question by Chair Phillips, states "if tax rates were 066 lowered, that would be the time to address this issue specifically" 088 Elizabeth Harchenko -Special Counsel to the Attorney General -states that passage of HB 3349B does not resolve every issue in the pending court case, but assists in possible resolution -in response to question from Sen.
