Governor's film & Video Office as opposed to Oregon Film & Video Office?

090       WOOLSON:       The name change was proposed by the Motion Picture Association  
of American, and they have withdrawn the proposal. From a marketing  
standpoint the proposal was not feasible.

099 SEN. DERFLER: Which amendments do you want?

101 WOOLSON: Refers committee to [EXHIBIT A]. Under the Commitment to Future State Financial Support section, I would support the SB 167-3 amendments. Under the Budget Review section, both SB 167-2 and SB 167-3 amendments are acceptable to me.

111 MOTION: SENATOR DERFLER MOVES to ADOPT the SB 167-2 amendments and SB 167-3 amendments.

113 VOTE: CHAIR LIM: Hearing no objection, the amendments above are ADOPTED. SENATOR DUKES is EXCUSED.

116 MOTION: SENATOR DERFLER MOVES SB 167, AS AMENDED ABOVE, to the Senate Floor with a DO PASS WITH AMENDMENTS recommendation.

115 CORTRIGHT: Raises an issue of possible conflict between the two amendments as it relates to the budget process. No conflict was found to exist.

135 VOTE: PASSES In a roll call vote, all members present vote AYE. SENATOR DUKES is EXCUSED.

138 CHAIR LIM: The motion PASSES.

139 SENATOR LIM will lead discussion on the Senate Floor.

143 CHAIR LIM: Closed WORK SESSION on SB 167.

215 SEN. KENNEMER: How many apprentices are in the building trades?

219 STEVE SWISHER: There are approximately 30 apprentices in construction trades.

228 SEN. KENNEMER: Is participation in the youth apprentices program voluntary?

230 SWISHER: Yes, that is correct.

237 SEN. KENNEMER: So, if a union did not like the program they could elect not to participate.

241 SWISHER: Yes, any employer or apprenticeship committee could choose to not participate in the program.

263 MOTION: SENATOR KENNEMER MOVES to ADOPT SB 242-1 amendments and that SB 242-1 amendments be further amended on page 1, lines 11-24, page 2, deleted.

266 SEN. BRADBURY: My initial understanding, based on conversations with representatives of building trades, was that they were concerned about being included in the change of the minimum wage requirement. After trying to draft an amendment on their behalf, I found that they were primarily concerned about the overall youth apprenticeship program.

286 SEN. KENNEMER: It is a voluntary program and if someone does not like the program they are not required to participate.

300 SEN. BRADBURY: Is the program voluntary from an employers stand point?

305 SEN. KENNEMER: Yes, the employer decides whether or not to participate in

the program.

310 Committee discussion to clarify the motion on the floor.

320 CORTRIGHT: If you want to pass the motion on the floor, the effect will be to go back to the way the law is now.

325 Committee discussion continues to seek clarification of the motion on the floor.

364 MOTION WITHDRAWN: SENATOR KENNEMER withdraws his motion.

370 MOTION: SENATOR KENNEMER MOVES to ADOPT lines 1-10 on page 1 of the SB 242-1 amendments.

378 VOTE: CHAIR LIM: Hearing no objection, the amendments above are ADOPTED. All members are present.

380 MOTION: SENATOR KENNEMER MOVES SB 242, AS AMENDED ABOVE, to the Senate Floor with a DO PASS WITH AMENDMENTS recommendation.

382 VOTE: PASSES In a roll call vote, SENATOR DERFLER, DUKES, KENNEMER, and LIM vote AYE. SENATOR BRADBURY vote NO.

389 CHAIR LIM: The motion PASSES.

391 SENATOR DERFLER will lead discussion on the Senate Floor.

395 CHAIR LIM: Closed WORK SESSION on SB 242.
