004 CHAIR ADAMS: Convenes the Conference Committee for SB 1006 at 4:05 PM.

Opens a work session on SB 1006B

009 CHAIR ADAMS: Explains the bill and describes the -B6 amendments dated
5-31-95
[EXHIBIT A].

023 Responds to Rep. Repine regarding the allocation of water rights during
the interim period. Water rights will continue to be applicable.
-References page 2, line 8 of the -B6 amendments; the conditional permit
will still be valid in the
area of the water usage.

034 MARTHA PAGEL, OREGON WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT: Responds to Rep.
Repine regarding the condition of the extra water allocation in the Grants
Pass irrigation district.
-The certificated water right is 96.94 CFS, under the new permit held by
the Grants Pass irrigation district; additional CFS figure is included in
the bill.

055 REP. REPINE: Discusses with the committee where the cost or budget
provision of the 15 person group, will be coming from.

069 PAGEL: There is no specific budget provision. Our expectation was that
we would contribute the staff who already had been working on that project,
within our existing budget, and that this project would not require
additional studies or an additional level of work beyond that which we have
been accustomed to.

093 CHAIR ADAMS: If we have adequate resources available through the Ways
and Means process then it would be preferable to have study that talks
specifically to this dam and looks at the issues surrounding this
particular dam.
-Refers to page 3, line 28-30 of the -B6 amendments, regarding the task
force and the need for further allocation of funds.

106 MOTION: SEN. CEASE: Moves to ADOPT the dash B6 amendments to SB

1006.

VOTE: Hearing no objection the MOTION CARRIES.

120 PAGEL: Introduces and discusses the conceptual amendments offered by
the Governor's office to SB 1006B [EXHIBIT B].

162 REP. REPINE: Objects to number 3 of the conceptual amendments regarding

the development of "...a finite set of alternatives to provide for fish passage and water resource management...".

171 PAGEL: This language is a result of a portion of the dash B5 amendments which were previously circulated.

 -Responds to Chair Adams regarding the unnecessary "dam removal" language.
 -Responds to Rep. Repine in regard to conceptual changes being proposed that may be parallel to amendments in the dash B6 amendments.
 -Explains the differences in the efficiency issue, between section 1, sub-section 2 and the dash B6 amendments.

256 MOTION: SEN. KINTIGH: Moves the to ADOPT the conceptual amendments to SB 1006B presented by the Oregon Water Resources Department, with the exception of item number 3.

VOTE: Hearing no objection the MOTION CARRIES. All members are present.

268 MOTION: SEN. CEASE: The Senate recede from the House amendments dated 5-15-95 and that SB 1006B be amended by the SB 1006-B6 amendments (Exhibit A) and by the conceptual amendments (Exhibit B) and that the bill be repassed.
