CHAIR KINTIGH: Convenes the meeting at 4:10 PM.

Opens the Work Session on SB 158

FRED ROBINSON, Department of Forestry MELINDA BRUCE, Attorney General's Office

FRED ROBINSON, DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY: Discusses the objections to the House Amendments to the A-Engrossed bill.

-Line 19, page 3 of SB 158 B-Engrossed bill; discusses the changes in language regarding the onset of fires by children.

MELINDA BRUCE, ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE: Discusses the problem with the language. Currently the bill as written establishes a standard that is

difficult to prove where children are involved; refers to the word "negligence" and compares the accountability of adults versus children. -Discusses the recovery costs of children who start fires and changing the language in the bill to read similar to the existing statute 481.58; fires caused by kids and fireworks.

064 REP. CORCORAN: There was a lot of discussion on the House Side regarding having a standard of behavior. Suggests that if the standard using the language of "negligent or willfully is too high then we should use the standard for liability for tort by child; "intentionally or recklessly".

SEN. JOHNSON: What are the repercussions for the adult who committed the offense of negligently leaving a fire to start a larger fire? It's not

necessary to make a child liable more so than an adult.

BRUCE: If the committee is considering using the standard of "intentionally or recklessly", then it is the Department of Forestry's position that the bill is better off without section 6.
