- Feels proposed bill falls short of meeting childrens needs  
- Need an agency like CSD for control  
- Submits and reads written testimony (EXHIBIT A)

112 CHRISTY ANN: Happy to be alive thanks to CSD

125 CHAIR ADAMS: No intention of removing those necessary  
services

154 SHOVE: Speaks in opposition of the bill
