TAPE 63, SIDE A

003 CHAIR REPINE: Calls the meeting to order at 8:35 a.m.

PUBLIC HEARING ON HB 3261

012 JANET McCOMB, COMMITTEE ADMINISTRATOR: Outlines Preliminary Staff Measure Summary (EXHIBIT A).

023 REP. JIM WHITTY, HOUSE DISTRICT 47: Submits and reviews testimony and proposed amendments to HB 3261 (EXHIBIT B).

071 REP. WOOTEN: Would the organizations participating under a non-profit status be required to have food handler cards and comply with the

sanitary laws of the Health Division? Would they pay a fee?

REP. WHITTY: They would sign a waiver stating that they are benevolent and not for profit. If they do not sign the waiver then they must pay the inspection fee.

123 TOM JOHNSON, ASSISTANT ADMINISTRATOR, CENTER FOR ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH: Submits and reviews testimony in favor of HB 3261 (EXHIBIT C).

174 REP. VanLEEUVEN: Questions the proposed amendments.

MR. JOHNSON: This language refers to those organizations that may be in business themselves. 219 MIKE McCALLUM, OREGON RESTAURANT ASSOCIATION: Speaks to the proposed amendments. This language could complicate the benevolent language.

The non profit statement could be misleading. Suggests including the language "all proceeds".

307 CHAIR REPINE: Intent of the bill is important.

TAPE 67, SIDE A

007 CHAIR REPINE: Suggests the three parties involved discuss the proposed amendments.

PUBLIC HEARING ON HB 2914

020 JANET McCOMB, COMMITTEE ADMINISTRATOR: Outlines the bill and speaks to the fiscal analysis of HB 2914 (EXHIBIT D).

039 FRED VanNATTA, AFFORDABLE HOUSING AGENCY: Speaks to the fiscal analysis.

084 REP. WOOTEN: Expresses concern with the fiscal impact of the bill.

116 MR. VanNATTA: Responds.

156 GARY WICKS, ADMINISTRATOR, BUILDING CODES AGENCY: Emphasized that they did not know what the bill will require in terms of a detailed analysis. -No position on the bill.

250 CHAIR REPINE: When rules are prepared, do you also prepare a fiscal impact statement?

MR. WICKS: The Administrative Procedures Act requires that a fiscal impact statement is done when adopting rules.

352 CHAIR REPINE: If you were to make code changes this coming biennium, would you have this in your budget or would you need to come back for

more money?

MR. WICKS: We have a general amount of money in our budget for code changes and we could make those code changes within this general amount of money available.

TAPE 66, SIDE B

007 REP. VanLEEuwEN: Reads from ORS 183.335(2)(b)(D) (EXHIBIT E).

026 MR. WICKS: We believe we are complying with this section, although we do not comply with this section by doing the detailed analysis as

required in Section 3.

076 DON MINER, OREGON MANUFACTURED HOUSING: The Building Codes Agency is a fee supported agency. The requesters of this legislation will be paying the costs, the cost will not be borne by the general fund.

127 MR. WICKS: HB 2914 is a recognition that the fees imposed by local jurisdiction and by the Building Codes Agency are paid by the people who buy the houses and the manufactured homes.
