080 Administrator Johnston submits measure summary packet (Exhibit I)

080 Yvonne Addington, Oregon Economic Development Department, testifies in support of the bill > Increases the authority to raise bonds > Have in the past used lottery dollars and grants but now seek to expand the use of bonds > Bill attempts to improve bond banks > Answers members' questions 163 > Rep. Beyer expresses his support for the bill because it works for small communities > Rep. Wooten also expresses her support for the bill > Rep. Payne asks whether this will raise local taxes. It should not increase taxes and there are safeguards to prevent increases in taxes > Rep. Starr asks whether Measure 5 would be a limiting factor. No. These bonds are not under compression from Measure 5 > Rep. Beyer explains that cities usually would have a vote to approve receiving the bonds

259 Rep. Tiernan asks why this is not a revenue issue > This bill does not raise revenue. It affects local governments only at their

choice

319 Rep. Watt worries that it will tax people more 335 > Rep. Beyer explains that all this bill does is allow local governments to get loans at a cheaper rate 360 Rep. Payne expresses his agreement with Rep. Watt that this will raise local taxes > Rep. Wooten explains why this is not a tax 420 > Yvonne Addington uses examples from Baker City to explain how this bill will benefit cities
