027 REP. REPINE: Speaks to the proposed amendments.

032 REP. WATT: Was there negative testimony?

034 REP. REPINE: The only negative testimony was from the credit union representatives. Those concerns have been addressed in the HB 2034-1

amendments.

037 REP. WOOTEN: Added that there will be standards by which candidates are judged, so there is not subjectivity nor second guessing about

qualifications.

124 REP. NAITO: Explains language in the HB 2048-1 and HB 204 8-2 amendments.

142 REP. TIERNAN: Expresses concern with the bill. -How does the Board determine the definition of prevailing?

157 ED GRAHAM, BOARD OF ENGINEERING EXAMINERS: Explains the Board's procedures follow the Administrative Procedures Act. -Bill is intended to be used as a compliance tool, rather than to

generate revenue. -Answers questions from the members. -There is frequently more than one issue involved and the Board would

prevail on all issues before the fee could be collected.

MR. GRAHAM: The prevailing party would need to take steps in order to recover their costs. The Board would not offer to pay the costs.
