007 JANET ADKINS, COMMITTEE ADMINISTRATOR: Reviews SB 259. > Relating to maritime pilots. > Page 3, board authorities and competency testing.

100 SEN. JOAN DUKES, DISTRICT 1: Testifies in favor of SB 259. > Discusses requirements for employment and issues of affirmative

action.

262 REP. EDMUNSON: Asks Dukes if the bill makes a distinction between bar pilots and other types of pilots.

270 SEN. DUKES: Replies that it does not; that distinction is up to the board of maritime pilots. > Discusses how the standards have been

set.

334 REP. EDMUNSON: Asks Dukes about affirmative action. > What are the recourses for not obeying this law?

344 SEN. DUKES: Indicates that she is unsure of the ramifications. > There is an affirmative action member on the board of maritime pilots currently.

040 SEN. GORDON SMITH, DISTRICT 17: Testifies in favor of SB 259. > Refers to a letter submitted in EXHIBIT H.

176 REP. NORRIS: Asks the panel of Senators if there is a problem currently with safety.

184 SEN. DUKES: Responds by stating that the system is safe due to the fact that the individuals piloting the ships are trained appropriately. > Uses an analogy of electrical apprenticeship.

235 SEN. SMITH: States that the previous focus was money, not safety.

265 SEN. CATHERINE WEBBER, DISTRICT 16: Testifies in favor of the bill. > There are alternative ways to get into this business

352 JOHN BURNS, WESTERN STATES PETROLEUM ASSOCIATION: Testifies in opposition to SB 259. > Reduction in the safety requirements in the amendments to the

original bill in the Senate > Oil tankers require skill and experience of the highest level for

the pilots to take the ships across the bar and up the river > Feel training should be increased rather than minimizing > Support affirmative actions of this bill

020 TOM GALLAGHER, ARCO: Testifies in opposition to SB 259. > Agrees with what John Burns said

026 REP. NORRIS: Asks Gallagher what effect afirmative action will have on ships from other countries with differing cultural standards.

034 GALLAGHER: Replies that there would probably be no cultural obstacles with women or minorities piloting the ships.

038 CINDY ZIEL, B.P. OIL: Testifies in opposition to the bill as it stands. > Only screening we have is the trainee licensure which is the toughest hurdle to becoming a pilot on the Columbia Bar

049 CAPTAIN PAUL JACKSON, COLUMBIA RIVER BAR PILOTS: Testifies in opposition to SB 259. > Refers to his letter in EXHIBIT H. > Presents letter previously submitted to Senator Jim Bunn (EXHIBIT B). 345 CAPTAIN JEFF STONE, COLUMBIA RIVER BAR PILOT: Presents testimony in opposition to SB 259 (EXHIBIT C).

037 KEVIN DAVIS, COLUMBIA RIVER PILOTS: Testifies in opposition to SB 259 . > The safety record on the river is excellent > Average experience of Columbia River Pilots now has been 16 years in

command or working on the tug boats on the Columbia River system > Would take 5-7 years to get a woman pilot through the existing

training qualification mechanisms

095 REP. EDMUNSON: Asks if he agrees with Section 7.

099 DAVIS: Indicates that this is a problem, but he is willing to work on the bill so all parties are in agreement.
