MELANIE ZERMER, COMMITTEE ADMINISTRATOR: reviews previous work on bill,
notes -2 amendment was adopted at previous work session -3 amendment at
the request of the Health Division (EXHIBIT A)

MOTION: Rep. Luke moves the -3 amendment for adoption

VOTE: Hearing no objection the amendment is ADOPTED

MOTION: Rep. Luke moves HB 2569 as amended with the -2 and -3
amendments to the floor with a do pass recommendation

VOTE: In a roll call vote, the motion carries, with all members present
voting AYE Rep. Hosticka will carry the bill

HB 2869 - Public Hearing

082 REP. WOOTEN: Bill is essentially a renewal of the Oregon
Lender's Tax Credit Program -raises cap to sixty-five million -by
incorporating cap and geographic dispersal allocation formula, the
needs of all members of the legislature will be met

140 language in bill is permissive -asks that bill be viewed in light of a subsequent referral to Revenue

170 Responds to questions from the members

227 Pros and cons of cap -unpredictable revenue impact -gives the option to lenders and/or agencies to exceed the sixty-five

million without the additional oversight by the Legislative Assembly -structure and boundaries required -2.6 million dollar general fund fiscal impact -creation of jobs and permanent shelter

250 PETER GRUNDFOSSEN, ASSOCIATION OF OREGON HOUSING AUTHORITIES: Strongly supports the bill -bill provides tax credits to lenders who drop their interest rates

below market rate

331 MICKEY LANSING CLAY, LUTHERAN PUBLIC POLICY: supports the bill
