101 DAN SIMMONS, DIRECTOR, EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT: supports concepts embraced in the bill -It is consistent with the Governor's budget -Benchmarks -Lottery dollars -work force -infrastructure -perspective of Department of Human Resources -consistent and compatible with other reform 189 \$500,000 appropriation may not be necessary for 1993-95

220 PAUL WARNER, STATE ECONOMIST: outlines Executive Department's response to bill -impact of budget decisions are long term -rate of return emphasis

Key necessary steps: -better understanding of what's driving long term growth in the economy -link impact of expenditure and tax policy to determinates of growth 270 -establish measures linking individual programs to policy area
