300 LT. BILL JOHNSON, OREGON STATE POLICE: Presents testimony in favor of HB 2477 (EXHIBIT A). -There are some major loopholes in the existing statute dealing with two party accidents.

362 REP. BROWN: Asks Johnson about individuals who are medically unable to make a report.

370 JOHNSON: Replies there exist exceptions to this rule in cases where an individual physically can not make out the report.

390 CHAIR TIERNAN: States that the way the law is now, an individual who gets in a hit-and-run accident while intoxicated can only be charged

with Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants.

400 ROSS SHEPARD, OREGON CRIMINAL DEFENSE LAWYERS ASSOCIATION: Makes statement on bill. -The reason it came about was that there was a case where a person was

killed in an accident, and the other party did not feel as if they

should stay to render aid to a dead person.
