[--- Unable To Translate Graphic ---] TAPE 3, SIDE A 005 CHAIR VanLEEUWEN: Calls the meeting to order at 3:38 p.m. 017 CATHERINE FITCH, Committee Administrator: Explains HB 2242. 033 FRED ROBINSON, Forestry: Presents written testimony (EXHIBIT A) on Department of Forestry Log Patrol Licensing Program and recommends passage of measure. 097 RICK GIBSON, Forestry: Outlines current licensing procedures to be eliminated upon measure passage. 140 CHAIR VanLEUUWEN: Requests identification of waterways affected by measure. 144 GIBSON: In theory, it includes the Columbia and all navigable portions of tributaries, but has been limited to the Willamette below

Willamette Falls and the Columbia below Bonneville Dam. 158 CHAIR VanLEUUWEN: Requests information regarding water usage

for log storage.

169 GIBSON: Waterways are currently used only for periodic movement of

logs to ships for export. 073 ROBINSON: There may still be some log rafting in the Coos Bay area. This measure does not affect any waterways except direct tributaries to the Columbia.

178 Discussion of past river usage by timber industry. Increased value of logs has necessitated other methods of transport, such as trains, barges or trucks.

202 Discussion of future safety of affected waterways for other users.

230 CHAIR VanLEUUWEN: Whose responsibility will it be to see that these waterways are clear?

231 ROBINSON: I don't know.
