009 RICK BURKE testified that his department would be able to administer the provisions of HB 3171, and that it would have only a minor impact on his agency.

020 RICK BURKE commented about the "priority provisions" in HB 3171. He said the term "innovative school programs" in HB 3171 would be defined within the context of HB 2565, and from alternative education activities.

021 RICK BURKE did not have any personal objections to using lottery funds for educational capital construction, but his agency did not want to take a position on this issue.
