030 DR. STAN WEED, DIRECTOR, INSTITUTE FOR RESEARCH AND EVALUATION:  
Gives overhead presentation discussing Institute research data on  
teen

sexuality and sexual activity. Value system is an important factor in  
predicting sexual activity.

220      SEN. CEASE:    How do you get to teens who are already sexually  
active? Weed: The teens most responsive are the ones who already have  
had a

sexual experience. They are also the ones least likely to practice safe  
sex. They don't have a clear sense of the future. They think they are  
victims of their environment.

270 SEN. PHILLIPS: Is this a moral issue or one of societal challenge that needs to be dealt with in the education system? Have we exasperated

the problem with the way we've dealt with it?

Weed: Discusses national trends of teen pregnancy. Schools and parents should be supportive of each other in these issues. Children get sex education through the media and their peers; we should improve it.

SEN. PHILLIPS: Is the problem the unwanted pregnancy or the sexual activity?

Weed: It's both a moral issue and a health issue.

340 SEN. PHILLIPS: How do you quantify the social costs?

Weed: Discusses federal government's estimate of costs.

360 CHAIR WEBBER: What was your sample?

Weed: Discusses study methodology.

390 CHAIR WEBBER: Comments on school-based teen clinics.

SEN. CEASE: They are successful because of the support they are given.

SEN. PHILLIPS: How would you compare HB 3332 with other states?

Weed: Abstinence is becoming more politically acceptable.
