014 CHAIR COHEN: Convenes meeting at 8:35 a.m.

WFQC - Workforce Development Strategies - Private Sector Participation

030 VERN RYLES: Begins presentation on workforce development.

044 CAM PREUS-BRALY: Overviews the history of council. Submits Workforce Quality Council presentation (EXHIBIT A). Also submits Executive Summary of Oregon Workforce Quality Council "Bottom Line" Report (EXHIBIT B). 097 RYLES: Overviews private participation in workforce quality council. Also presents information from EXHIBIT A.

270 JON EGGE: Continues presentation of private-sector needs and participation.

440 SEN. LIM: What we need is a manufacturing base for economic growth - not dependence on services, sales, managerial, professional, etc.

RYLES: I agree. That is why we want to invest in research and development, infrastructure, etc., things that will stimulate the high-wage

industries.

471 SEN. LIM: We need a strategy for more high technology or manufacturing and trade so that we can develop that economic growth.

030 CHAIR COHEN: That is one reason for our list of key industries. I assume that the Workforce Quality Council and the regional councils are focusing on those industries in their training initiatives, etc.

040 RYLES: There are a number of needs in our current workforce: remedial education, retraining of dislocated workers, and current workers who need additional skill levels. The private sector strategy is to leverage public dollars with private investment in on-line worker training.

092 SEN. GOLD: Regarding the configuration of service areas, do these areas resemble service areas developed for ESD's and DHR?

RYLES: Our fifteen service areas are closely configured to ESD's. I am not familiar with DHR's.

110 PREUS-BRALY: There are only two ESD regions that do not match with our regional areas. DHR's regions do match.

122 CHAIR COHEN: In your discussion about apprenticeship, are you also talking about student apprenticeship?

128 EGGE: Overviews current apprenticeship processes. The value of youth apprenticeship is to try to back the age of starting apprentices (currently age 27, for example, in the electrical field). However, this is a very competitive process with many applicants (283 qualified applicants for 15 apprenticeship slots), many of them very highly educated (23 percent were graduates of a four-year college).
