#### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Establishes brewery-public house license. Allows brewery-public house licensees to brew and sell malt beverages up to eight percent alcohol.

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#### 2 Relating to malt beverages; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 471.290. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: **SECTION 1.** Section 2 of this Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 471. **SECTION 2.** (1) A brewery-public house license shall allow the licensee: (a) To manufacture annually on the licensed premises no more than 25,000 barrels of malt beverages containing not more than eight percent of alcohol by weight; (b) To sell on the licensed premises at retail malt beverage manufactured on the premises in unpasteurized 8 form directly to the consumer for consumption off the premises, delivery of which may be made in a container 9 10 supplied by the consumer; (c) To sell unpasteurized malt beverages manufactured on or off the licensed premises at retail for 11 consumption on the premises; 12 (d) To sell pasteurized malt beverages not manufactured on the licensed premises at retail directly to the 13 consumer for consumption on or off the premises; and 14 15 (e) To conduct the activities described in paragraphs (b) to (d) of this subsection on premises other than the premises where the manufacturing occurs but only as an alternative to selling for consumption on the premises 16 17 where manufacturing occurs. (2) Subsection (1) of this section does not authorize the licensee to import malt beverages. 18 (3) ORS 471.452, 471.455, 471.456 and 471.460 do not apply to persons holding a license under this section. 19 (4) A licensee under this section is eligible for a retail malt beverage license. 20 (5) For purposes of ORS chapter 473, a brewery-public house licensee shall be considered to be a 21 manufacturer. 22 SECTION 3. ORS 471.290 is amended to read: 23 471,290. (1) Any person desiring a license or renewal of a license shall make application to the commission 24

upon forms to be furnished by the commission showing the name and address of the applicant, the applicant's

citizenship, location of the place of business which is to be operated under the license, and such other pertinent information as the commission may require. No license shall be granted or renewed until the provisions of the Liquor Control Act and the rules of the commission have been complied with.

- (2) Except as provided in this section, the commission shall assess a nonrefundable fee for processing each application for any license authorized by ORS chapter 471 or 472, in an amount equal to 25 percent of the annual license fee. The commission shall not begin to process any license application until the application fee is paid. If the commission allows an applicant to apply at the same time for alternative licenses at one premises, only the application fee for the most expensive license shall be required. If a license is granted or committed, the application fee of 25 percent shall be applied against the annual license fee. This subsection shall not apply to an agent's license, a salesman's license, a manufacturer certificate of approval, a druggist's license, a health care facility license, a brewery-public house license or to any license which is issued for a period of less than 30 days.
- (3) Subject to subsection (4) of this section, the commission shall assess a nonrefundable fee for processing a renewal application for any license authorized by ORS chapter 471 or 472 only if the renewal application is received by the commission less than 20 days before expiration of the license. If the renewal application is received prior to expiration of the license but less than 20 days prior to expiration, this fee shall be 25 percent of the annual license fee. If a renewal application is received by the commission after expiration of the license but no more than 30 days after expiration, this fee shall be 40 percent of the annual license fee. This subsection shall not apply to an agent's license, a salesman's license, a manufacturer certificate of approval, a druggist's license, a health care facility license or to any license which is issued for a period of less than 30 days.
- (4) The commission may waive the fee imposed under subsection (3) of this section if it finds that failure to submit a timely application was due to unforeseen circumstances or to a delay in processing the application by the local governing authority that is no fault of the licensee.
- (5) The annual license fee is nonrefundable and shall be paid by each applicant upon the granting or committing of a license. The annual license fee and the minimum bond required of each class of license are as follows:

MEASURE: HB 2284

Title: Relating to malt beverages and amending ORS 471.290.

Establishes a new license which would provide for a brewery -- public house.

Committee: House Consumer and Business Affairs

Hearing dates: February 7th ( hearing and work session ).

Explanation prepared by: James Jones, Committee Administrator

Although "microbreweries" are currently allowed to brew malt beverages, they are not permitted to sell them on premises.

Until prohibition, Oregon (in particular Portland) had numerous small breweries.

After prohibition ended, the era of mergers, acquisitions and growth prevailed. Recently several of these small or "micro" breweries have once again begun to brew malt beverages in small quanities in the early European and Northwestern tradition. There are now several of these "microbreweries" in the Portland area. Note\* Comparatively, these small or tiny breweries brew around 1,000 to 6,000 31-gallon barrels annually. This is compared to the current yearly output of Anheuser-Bush which is 50 million barrels.

Issues discussed included ways for the microbreweries to promote themselves to local residents and visitors and the need to sell their product on their own premises or at other microbreweries.

Amendments suggested were all "friendly" and have the support of sponsors. The amendments clarify the bill with regard to the type of license, require the breweries to pay taxes on their products, increase the fee for a license and define a "microbrewery" as a manufacturer for tax purposes.

Note\*\*\*. The Committee wanted the legislative intent to be clear that the tax credit allowed for purchase of manufacturing equipment was to be only for use in the manufacturing of the malt beverage and that any financial transaction—such as the sale of the facility—was to be an "at arms length" transaction; i.e. at fair market value, at a good distance and a business—like transaction which can be reasonably expected to be honored even though the parties may be related.
