010 CHAIR FORD: Calls the meeting to order at 1:08 p.m.

WORK SESSION: HB 3135 - Disabled Parking

MOTION: REPRESENTATIVE RIJKEN MOVES TO SUSPEND THE RULES IN ORDER TO RECONSIDER THE VOTE.

KELLY TAYLOR, MOTOR VEHICLES DIVISION: Explains the fiscal error in the bill. The loss is due to the 90 cent cost to make each placard out of a durable material. If the durable plastic is not used, this bill will save money. A person can have their placard laminated at their own expense.

058 MELANIE ZERMER: Submits and explains HB 3135-5 proposed amendments (EXHIBIT A), a hand-engrossed version of the proposed amendments (EXHIBIT B), a fiscal analysis (EXHIBIT C), and a revenue impact on HB 3135 (EXHIBIT D). - Explains technical error in the proposed amendments.

135 DONNA BLEILER, DEPARTMENT OF INSURANCE AND FINANCE: Testifies in favor of SB 466 as long as it includes the definition of nonprofit corporation.

190 DAN BARKER, MENTAL HEALTH AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY SERVICES DIVISION: Submits and reads written testimony in favor of SB 48 (EXHIBIT E). - The technical error in statute came to our attention when compiling a handbook on confidentiality.

290 KATE VANLUVEN, SEN. LARRY HILL'S STAFF: Submits and reads written testimony in favor of SB 462 (EXHIBIT F).

370 DAVE HULSE, SENIOR AND DISABLED SERVICES DIVISION: There is no definition for "disabled dependent" in current law.

002 TIM NAY, LAW OFFICE OF TIM NAY: Testifies in favor of SB 462. - This legislation would be useful for other purposes including the ability to deposit funds for disabled family members. - Describes language on page 3, lines 6-9 regarding distribution of money in the Disabilities Trust Fund. - Families are ready to do this but are waiting for a mechanism to do so. - Explains medicaid program eligibility asset limits.

HULSE: Describes administration of funds. - In response to

365 MARY DOLLIN, MENTAL HEALTH AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY SERVICES DIVISION: Explains how this bill would speed up the process in discharging certain persons from state hospital.

REPRESENTATIVE MEEK: Not sure if this really speeds up the process because of notice requirements to the Attorney General's Office.

CHAIR FORD: Will bring this back when we have the Attorney General's Office and the Psychiatric Review Board staff present. - Adjourns the meeting at 2:07 p.m.
