TAPE 1, SIDE A

000 CHAIR BAUM convenes the meeting at 8:10 a.m. Committee will meet every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday at 8:00 a.m.; meetings will last until about 30 minutes before House floor session commences. Due to scheduling conflicts, the House and Senate Committees are not able to meet jointly, but maybe some joint meetings can be arranged. He requests members let him know what their particular economic development interests are.

037 Discussion continues regarding scheduling.

057 REP. CARTER: The T&E Committee has always been a bi-partisan committee - not as political as some others.

069 CHAIR BAUM: We will operate by consensus and try to continue that bi-partisanship operation, and try to move legislation in concert with the Senate Committee. Major packages of legislation will be worked by one side and then moved to the other side.

085 CHAIR BAUM continues announcements about committee operation.

120 Members introduced themselves and described districts they represent. Adoption of Committee Rules

192 MOTION: Rep. Katz moves adoption of the Committee Rules (EXHIBIT A).

VOTE: By roll call vote, the motion to adopt the Committee Rules passes (6-0). Voting AYE: Reps. Baum, Barnes, Carter, Katz, McTeague, Pickard. Excused:

Rep. Hayden.

217 Staff introduced themselves.

272 CORTRIGHT begins review of the committee staff report "1989 Major Economic Development Legislation" (EXHIBIT B).

350 REP. KATZ comments that the Oregon Benchmarks may be one of the most important documents ever prepared for the Legislature and she has requested/recommended that the benchmarks be referred to the Trade Committee, but that they be reviewed by every committee.

386 Presentation of "House Bills in Committee" (EXHIBIT C).

035 CORTRIGHT continues presentation of EXHIBIT B.

060 TAMI MILLER begins presentation of workforce section of EXHIBIT B. She presented more detailed information (Summary of Workforce 2000 Program) EXHIBIT D.

160 REP. MC TEAGUE: Why is this fund tied to Sports Programs?

MILLER: The decision was made in the Ways and Means Committee.

227 MILLER continues presentation of EXHIBIT D (OPPS & Workforce Assessment).

275 REP. KATZ: How many outcomes of these programs can be measured?

CORTRIGHT: The majority of these funds have been too recently disbursed for any outcome measurement. MILLER agrees these programs are too recent to be measured as far as results OPPS can track JTPA program participants and are almost ready to begin tracking Community College participants.

329 REP. CARTER: This measurement needs to be done.

370 REP. BAUM: I have had this discussion with the Senate Co-Chair. I want

to see an analysis of these lottery- funded programs.

393 REP. BARNES agrees with REP. CARTER about the need for program measurement.

400 MILLER begins presentation of Regional Strategies information (EXHIBIT E).

testimony from rural community leaders about the need for technical assistance.
