- 010 MOTION: Chair Shoemaker moves to introduce LC 3891 and LC 1961 as committee bills. 030 VOTE: The committee unanimously accepts the LCs as committee bills.
- 043 DAVE HOUK: Representing himself. Sees a need for this bill if for some reason the risk pool is not passed. If there is a one person who has been excluded from getting health insurance because of a preexisting condition and if this bill could help that one person, then this bill should be moved forward. 070 SENATOR HANNON: All this bill does is allow a person to ask their insurer to reconsider covering excluded services. You should be clear that this bill does not mandate insurers to give people coverage.
- 110 JOHN POWELL, BCBSO: BCBSO will reconsider an excluded service at any time. He believes this is a universal practice in the industry. So he sees no need for this bill. 138 CHAIR SHOEMAKER: Are you saying that this bill may hurt the consumer because currently most insurers will reconsider covering excluded services at any time, but the bill requires insurers to reconsider exclusions at specified time periods and therefore they may be more restricted in when they reconsider covering excluded services if this bill passes?
