TAPE 19, SIDE A

005 CHAIR ROBERTS: Opens public hearing on SB 1220.

008 DUKES: SB 1220 came at the request of the Columbia River Resource Task Force, which was created this session by the Senate President to look at what happens if species of fish are listed as threatened or endangered in the Columbia River. It looks at what might happen in Oregon and how to deal with that.

SB 1220 would set up a four state Columbia River Task Force. We wouldn't

begin our participation until at least two other states appoint members.

The only money involved is actual expenses incurred by the members (two Senators and two Representatives). Submits and summarizes fiscal analysis statement. (EXHIBIT A) It is not an additional \$10,000; it would come out of existing legislative assembly funds.

021 ROBERTS: This is the legislative assembly funds and the money would be expended depending upon the priorities set by the leadership.

024 MOTION: SEN. DUKES asked if there was objection to sending SB 1220 to the floor, thereby effectively moving SB 1220 to the floor with a "do pass" recommendation.

027 DUKES: Note that Sen. Duff, who is on the Columbia River Resource Task Force, is present. (Sen. Duff acknowledges that he is in favor of SB 1220)

029 VOTE: There being no objection, the motion was approved. Senator Hannon was excused. Senators Bradbury and Cohen were absent.

030 ROBERTS: Adjourns the meeting at 12:55 p.m..
