023 SENATOR JANE CEASE: Submits and reviews written testimony.(EXHIBIT ${\tt H}$)

069 SEN. MCCOY: Will the new route will go across the bridge?

072 SEN. CEASE: Explains the routes outlined in written testimony. (EXHIBIT ${\rm H}$)

075 SEN. DUFF: Asks about radioactive material.

094 MIKE GRAINEY, OREGON DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY: Submits and reviews written testimony.(EXHIBIT I)

110 BOB ROBISON, DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY: Explains ORS 469 in regard to administrative rules and hazardous shipments.

120 SEN. CEASE: The x-ray bi-product is included in the permitted material.

122 SEN. PHILLIPS: Discusses the transportation of x-ray bi-products.

130 GRAINEY: The law does not address that issue at all. This simply deals with the question of routing.

137 CEASE: This bill doesn't deal with anything established in 1981 regarding regulation of the material. This is a route issue.

142 SEN.PHILLIPS: Asks about placards that are required.

- 144 GRAINEY: The placard is dependent on the level.
- 147 SEN. PHILLIPS: Will they have to go through new routing procedures?
- 150 ROBISON: It won't change our process much at all. What this bill does is help the load being

carried out of Trojan meet Federal regulations. Ports of entry block the carrier from the route

we think, and the federal regulation states, they should be taking.

- 162 SEN. PHILLIPS: I want to make sure my district isn't going to have to change.
- 165 SEN. CEASE: There is no intent to go back over routes in Oregon to change them.
- 173 SEN. PHILLIPS: I don't want the process changed if it doesn't need to be in regard to Oregon routes.
- 177 SEN. TIMMS: What highways can carry what substances?
- 182 GRAINEY: The U.S. Department of Transportation has that authority.
- 189 ROBISON: Discusses what has happened in the development of radioactive material transportation.
- 198 SEN. TIMMS: Discusses secondary highways in regard to radioactive shipments.
- 209 SEN. CEASE: This bill does not address those other kinds of materials.
- 214 GRAINEY: Discusses the states limited authority.
- 223 SEN. BROCKMAN: In section 2 of SB 783 there is new language deleting railroads.
- 228 SEN. CEASE: Explains recent federal court decision regarding railroad regulation.
- 233 SEN. BROCKMAN: Also on line 8 of your testimony the language re-appears.
- 241 SEN. CEASE: Our intent is not to hold up any movement on material at all.
- 256 MICHAEL EYER, PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION: Discusses the Hazardous Material
