COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

RULES

(Adopted September 12, 1973)

- 1. The Chairmen shall call meetings and set the agenda.
- 2. The House Chairman and the Senate Chairman shall preside at meetings alternately.
- 3. A quorum shall consist of five committee members.
- 4. Official committee action shall require the approval of a majority of the Senate members and a majority of the House members.
- 5. A motion need not be seconded.
- 6. Subcommittees may be appointed by the Chairmen.
- 7. All meetings shall be open to the press and to the public.
- 8. Meetings may be adjourned or recessed upon motion or upon order of the presiding Chairman.
- 9. Rules may be changed by a majority vote of the Senate members and a majority vote of the House members.
- 10. In all cases when the foregoing rules are inapplicable,

 Mason's Manual of Legislative Procedure shall apply.

AMENDMENT TO RULES

(Adopted April 9, 1974)

Three Senate members shall constitute a quorum present of the Senate membership and a majority vote of two of the three Senate members shall be sufficient to take action.

SUBCOMMITTEE RULES

(Adopted January 8, 1974)

- 1. A quorum shall consist of three subcommittee members.
- Official subcommittee action shall require the approval of a majority of the quorum.
