
Let me know what I can do to help you in the coming year. I am in the country and available. No more sunshine for a while.

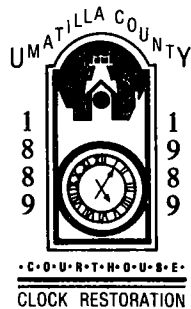

I am writing this without Rey's knowledge and am doing it because I have a suspicion that Rey may not get all of the credit he deserves.

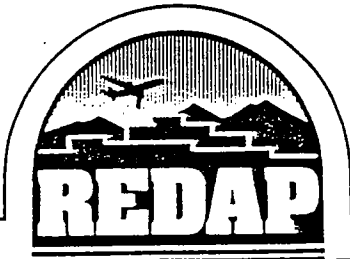

Dear Mr. Reilly:

The States of Oregon and Washington appreciate and welcome the recent decision to extend the deadline for nomination of estuaries to the National Estuary Program (NEP) from August 31, 1989 to November 1, 1989.

We concluded that additional time was required to more thoroughly assess this issue prior to learning of your decision. The extension for submission of nominations will provide us the opportunity to address some of the concerns we have heard regarding nomination. Specifically, we plan to develop a joint public education and involvement process to discuss:

1. Whether to submit the nomination;
2. The planning process if nomination is pursued; and
3. Alternatives to nomination.

The nomination process has proven to be complex. Presently, opinions are mixed regarding whether participation in the NEP is warranted at this time and whether the NEP is the appropriate mechanism for addressing potential water quality concerns on the Columbia River.

Although we remain committed to and supportive of the NEP, the experience with Puget Sound has shown that funds available under the NEP are not adequate to support development and implementation of the Comprehensive Conservation and Management Plans. As a result, an extensive commitment of state resources is required to support estuary program activities. The lack of funding available for implementation of management plans under the NEP, particularly if a significant clean up program is required, place an even greater burden on state and local resources. We will be looking closely at the resource issue as part of our activities during the next several months.




