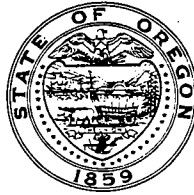


I am taking this opportunity to add my congratulations to the many others you've received for your three successful liver transplants since October 19.
