Dear Representative Oakley:

Thank you for your comments regarding the Veterans' Farm and Home Loan Program. Like you, I believe all of us can take a great deal of pride in the accomplishments that have been achieved.

The Newport Group, a private mortgage consultant firm, at the request of a commission I established, found that the Department of Veterans' Affairs was extremely efficient and rated in the top quartile nationally of multi-billion mortgage servicers. A subsequent study by Salik Associates reverified that earlier assessment. Both studies applauded what program management has accomplished.

The Department should be in a position to issue loans in the not too distant future. These loans will be underwritten to FHA standards and fully insured. The Department has closed all field offices and does not intend to reopen any. They have authority to, and intend to contract with qualified local lenders to originate veteran loans in order to make themselves available statewide.

Although the Department has qualified loan officers on staff in Salem, they do not initially plan to originate any loans internally. This has caused some concern with the veteran community and the Oregon Public Employees Union. We will continue to evaluate the needs of the veteran and the Department to assure that the quality of the program and the delivery of service is second to none.

My office, the Treasurer's office, and the management of the Department of Veterans' Affairs have worked hard to improve Oregon's bond rating; you may be assured that we intend to maintain their renewed confidence in the program.


Dear Governor Goldschmidt,

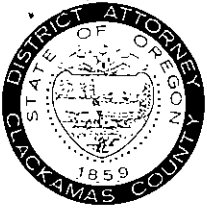

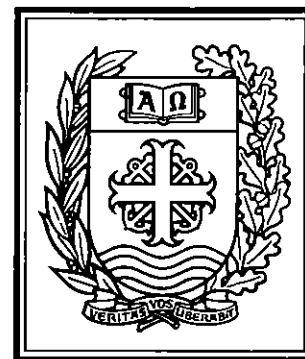
