POP 202 (2015) ORESTAR Upgrades (February 2016 Update)

• ORESTAR began in 2007 with just two (2) modules.

• It is now nine (9) years old with several more modules that were added over the years.

• Given the Election Cycle, maintaining and updating ORESTAR requires <u>BOTH</u> a:

– Short Term Plan

- Get us through the 2016 Election. Joint Ways & Means allocated \$285,000 for the agency's short term plan to address improvements and bug fixes.
- Long Term Plan
 - Put us on a path for an upgraded ORESTAR by the 2018 Election.

- Long Term Plan
 - **1. Completed:** ORESTAR assessment by consultant.
 - Identify modules to maintain in-house and modules that can be satisfied off-the-shelf with a vendor.
 - 2. In Process February 2016 Legislative Session: Report to Legislature on assessment and recommendations. If approved, additional funds allocated to agency.
 - **3. 2016-2017:** Agency implementation of recommendations.

- Results are not presented consistently among counties and are not easily understandable.

- Pending legislative approval of this request, a vendor has been identified through a competitive process.
 - \$300,000 for 2015-17 biennium contract cost.
 - \$49,500 for half-time 12 month limited duration project manager position and travel costs.

Total Request: \$349,500 for 2015-17 biennium.

Current system (ORESTAR)

- Only tracks state offices and races
- No customized views or searches

New Solution

- Tracks all races in the state
- Precinct level reporting
- Customized searches and views
- "Follow" select races on screen without scrolling
- Maps
- Graphical representations of data
