Then fill out your vote by mail ballot and return it to your county elections office by 8:00 pm on November 7th.

General Information

Voters' Pamphlet

Your official 2006 General Election Voters' Pamphlet is divided into two separate volumes. This is Volume 2 and contains information on candidates. You should have already received Volume 1, containing information on the statewide measures. If you have not received Volume 1, please call the toll-free voter information line at 1-866-ORE-VOTES (1-866-673-8683).

In this volume, partisan candidates appear before nonpartisan candidates. All space is purchased; statements and photographs are submitted by the candidates or their designated agents. The information required by law—pertaining to occupation, occupational background, educational background, and prior governmental experience—has been certified by each candidate.

Volume 2 also includes other voting aids, such as a complete listing of state candidates, ballot drop site locations, and ballot instructions. If your county has chosen to produce a voters' pamphlet in conjunction with the state, drop site locations will appear in your county voters' pamphlet, which is in the center of this pamphlet.

Candidate statements are printed as submitted by the author. The state does not correct punctuation, grammar, syntax errors or inaccurate information. The only changes made are attempts to correct spelling errors if the word as originally submitted is not in the dictionary.

The voters' pamphlet has been compiled by the Secretary of State since 1903, when Oregon became one of the first states to provide for the printing and distribution of such a publication. One copy of the voters' pamphlet is mailed to every household in the state. Additional copies are available at the State Capitol, local post offices, courthouses and all county elections offices.

Random Alphabet

While the candidates' statements for candidates running for the same office appear in alphabetical order by their last name in this voters' pamphlet, you will notice that they appear in a different order on your ballot.

ORS 254.155 requires the Secretary of State to complete a random order of the letters of the alphabet to determine the order in which the names of candidates appear on the ballot.

Important!

If your ballot is lost, destroyed, damaged or you make a mistake in marking your ballot, you may call your county elections office and request a replacement ballot. One will be mailed to you as long as you request it by November 2. After that, you may pick it up at the elections office. If you have already mailed your original ballot before you realize you made a mistake, you have cast your vote and will not be eligible for a replacement

Your voted ballot must be returned to your county elections office by 8:00 p.m. election day, Tuesday, November 7, 2006.

Postmarks do not count!

County elections offices are open on election day from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Official 2006 General Election Voters' Pamphlet

Voters with Disabilities

Voters with disabilities who need assistance with marking their ballots now have an opportunity to vote privately and independently. Each county elections office in Oregon has been equipped with a voting system for use by voters with disabilities.

Voters with disabilities who use assistive technology such as a computer with a screen reader or screen enlarger application to access printed material now have an alternative to the printed ballot. It is called a HTML (Computer) Ballot. The HTML (Computer) Ballot requires that the voter have a computer, web browser and printer and allows the voter to vote privately and independently from home.

General Information

Vote by Mail

What is Vote by Mail?

Vote by mail is a method of conducting elections. Instead of using traditional polling places where voters go to cast ballots on election day, a ballot is automatically mailed to each registered voter. The ballot is then voted and returned to the county elections official to be counted.

As a voter, what do I have to do?

Your ballot packet will automatically be mailed to you between October 20 and 24, 2006. Inside the packet you will find the ballot, a secrecy envelope and a return envelope. Once you vote the ballot, place it in the secrecy envelope and seal it in the pre-addressed return envelope. Be sure you sign the return envelope on the appropriate line. After that just return the ballot either by mail or at a designated dropsite.

What if I am uncomfortable voting my ballot at home?

Privacy booths are available for you to cast your ballot. There are privacy booths at your county elections office and there may be others at dropsite locations elsewhere in your county. For further information, call your county elections official.

What if my ballot doesn't come?

If you are registered to vote and have not received your ballot within a week after they are mailed, call your county elections office. They will check that your voter registration is current. If it is, they will mail you a replacement ballot.

What if I have moved and have not updated my registration?

If you were registered to vote by October 17 but now have a different address, call your county elections office for instructions on how to update your registration and receive a

Do I have to return my ballot by mail?

You have the choice of mailing your ballot or returning it to any county elections office or any designated dropsite in the state. The times and locations of dropsites are available at your county elections office.

How much postage is required to mail the ballot back?

Your voted ballot can usually be returned using a single 39¢ stamp. In those instances where additional postage is necessary, it will be clearly indicated on the ballot materials.

When must the voted ballot be returned?

The voted ballot must be received in any county elections office or designated dropsite by 8pm on election night. Postmarks do not count!

How do I know if my ballot is received?

You can call your county elections office and ask if they received your ballot. A record is kept showing each voter whose ballot has been returned.

Can anyone find out how I've voted once I mail my ballot?

No. All ballots are separated from the return envelope before the ballots are inspected. This process ensures confidentiality.

What if I forget to sign the return envelope?

Generally, your elections office will either return it to you for signing or they will contact you, if possible, to come to the elections office to sign it. If the return envelope does not get signed before 8pm on November 7, the ballot will not be counted.

Can the public watch the election process?

All steps of the process are open to observation by the public. Contact your county elections official to make arrangements.

When will election results be known?

Ballot counting cannot begin until election day. Initial results are released at 8pm election night and will continue to be updated through election night until all ballots have been counted.

Important!

If your ballot is lost, destroyed, damaged or you make a mistake in marking your ballot, you may call your county elections office and request a replacement ballot. One will be mailed to you as long as you request it by November 2. After that, you may pick it up at the elections office. Your voted ballot must be returned to your county elections office by 8pm election day, Tuesday, November 7, 2006.

Postmarks do not count!

County elections offices are open on election day from 7am to 8pm.

Provisional Ballot Information

You will be issued a provisional ballot if:

- → there is a question about your eligibility as a voter (for example, there is no evidence on file that you are an active or inactive voter in Oregon)
- → you need to vote at a County Elections Office in a county other than the one you live in

In order to obtain a provisional ballot, you need to fill out a Provisional Ballot Request Form in person at the County Elections Office.

Your provisional ballot will not be counted until it is determined that you are eligible to vote.

After you have voted the ballot, you can call 1-866-ORE-VOTES (1-866-673-8683) or the County Elections Office in which you voted to find out if your ballot was counted. If your ballot was not counted, you can also find out the reason it was not counted.

If it is determined that you are ineligible to vote in this election, the completed Provisional Ballot Request Form will serve as your voter registration for future elections.







SUMMARY: The County Court approved formation of the 4-H and Extension Service District in May, 2006. To fund activities of the District, the Court ordered an election. If approved, the District will serve all of Wasco County, excluding Warm Springs

Background

Since 1916, Oregon State University Wasco County Extension Service has served Wasco County. This service is provided through an agreement between Wasco County and OSU. Under this agreement Wasco County currently provides approximately 25% of the total costs for extension services in Wasco County through general fund dollars. The remaining 75% (over \$450,000 annually) comes from state and federal funds. In the agreement, Wasco County only pays for general operating expenses including office secretarial and support staff, rent, supplies, phone and other general operating expenses.

Over the last several years, county revenue shortfalls have reached a point where the county can no longer provide its part of the funding for the Wasco County Extension Service.

In order to keep 4-H and Extension in Wasco County, the Wasco County Court has recommended the creation of the Wasco County 4-H and Extension Service District. The establishment of a service district will provide sustainable, long term funding. If voters approve this measure, the Wasco County 4-H and Extension Service District will be formed with a permanent property tax rate of \$0.25 per thousand of assessed value that will ensure the continuation of services to Wasco County residents.

4-H & Extension Service Plan

The 4-H and Extension Service District will use the dedicated tax monies from the county to pay for office secretarial and support staff, rent, supplies, phone and other local operating expenses. The Wasco County Court will be the governing body of the District and responsible for overseeing the budget and general direction of programs and services provided by the 4-H and Extension District. Day-to-day operations will be managed by Oregon State University Faculty members in Wasco County.

The service district is asking for \$0.25 per thousand assessed valuation, \$50 a year on a property assessed at \$200,000. Isn't it worth that much to keep this valuable service in Wasco County?

Taxes may be used only for district operations. District could also buy new library materials, create countywide database, increase library hours, and provide library stations with computers. County Court would be district governing body. Court would appoint a library board for library district. New district includes all Wasco County except City of Mosier, and territory in Jefferson County Library District.

Explanatory Statement

Background

For decades, Wasco County has contributed funding to the four libraries in the County. The County and the City of The Dalles have contributed equal funding needed to jointly operate The Dalles-Wasco County Library. Since 1997, revenue shortfalls from Wasco County have resulted in reduced contributions to the library.

In 2005 the Wasco County Court decided it could no longer sustain its share of the funding and discontinued contributions to all libraries in Wasco County as of July 1, 2006. As a result, library hours in The Dalles have been reduced by half to 20 hours per week and funding for new books has been reduced by three-fourths.

Rather than eliminate the County funding that had sustained past library service levels, the County Court has submitted to County voters this measure to create a County Library Service District. If voters approve this measure, a library service district will be formed with a permanent property tax rate. If voters do not approve the district, non-City of The Dalles residents will be charged a non-resident fee to use The Dalles-Wasco County Library.

Public Libraries in Wasco County

There are three legally established public libraries in Wasco County: The Dalles-Wasco County Library, Dufur Community Library, and Southern Wasco County Library in Maupin. There is also a volunteer library in Mosier and a volunteer collection located at the Tygh Valley Community Center.

Library District Service Plan

A service plan was developed for the proposed library district with these goals:

- Set a reasonable tax rate adequate to sustain library services
- Raise service levels to state "adequate" library standards
- · Include services for everyone in the district
- Keep administrative costs low

Under the service plan, the library district could provide:

1. Library Hours

- 55 hours per week for The Dalles-Wasco County Library (20 hours now)
- Opportunity for 12 more evening or weekend hours for Dufur Community Library (2 evenings now)
- Opportunity for 20 hours per week for Southern Wasco County Library in Maupin (12 hours now)

2. Library Stations

Library stations would be established with computers for online access to a County Library web page, Gorgelink collections, County Library databases, and other on-line services. Stations would be located at Shaniko and Tygh Valley and serve as drop locations for courier delivery

3. Library Collection

- Funded at about \$3 per capita (funded at less than \$2 per capita now)

If insurance companies can establish a link between risk and any legal criteria, they have the right to price their products accordingly. Stacking the deck against insurance companies will only drive them away, leaving people with fewer companies who will have more control over the market - that's a REAL formula for high prices!

MEASURE 44: NO

People complain about pharmaceutical companies, but they sure like their medications. By opening the Prescription Drug Program to all, we effectively place a tax on pharmaceutical companies. Such companies may seem little more to us than faceless corporate targets for populist rage, but they are the ones who invent the drugs we need. It makes little sense to erode financial incentives to create new and more effective medications.

Reporting requirements on political campaigns are supposed to provide legal transparency. Instead, they create fear. Too often, individuals and groups with something to lose are afraid to contribute to political challengers for fear of antagonizing incumbents. What kind of democracy is that? Such regulations have a chilling effect on the democratic process. Restricting the ability of candidates to project their messages isn't the answer either. Big money doesn't always win, and voters have the ability to think for themselves. It is ironic that some who claim to treasure democracy place so little trust in the voters.


