Dear Fellow Oregonian,

By many accounts, this is one of the most historic election years in recent memory. Whether you are a long time voter or this is your first opportunity to vote, please use this voter guide to find valuable information about the candidates who would like to represent you.

This voters' pamphlet is sent to every household in Oregon. But you must be registered to vote to receive a ballot to cast in the upcoming election. If you are not yet registered to vote, you have a very short window – until April 26th 2016 – to do so. You can also visit oregonvotes.gov to check your registration status.

We are fortunate to live in a state that works to get a ballot in the hand of every eligible Oregonian. The Secretary of State's office is committed to making voting easy and convenient whether you are a first time voter, a voter serving in the military, or a person living with a disability. The health of our democracy depends on your participation.

Oregon was the first in the nation to implement an all vote-by-mail system and we consistently have some of the nation's highest voter turnout rates. This January, we implemented "Oregon Motor Voter" – a program that automatically registers qualified Oregonians to vote when they renew or apply for an Oregon driver's license, permit, or ID card. Tens of thousands of Oregonians will have their very first opportunity to participate in this election. If you are one of them, let me welcome you to the democratic process! Your vote is your voice and every single voice matters.

It's your decision whether to mail in the ballot or drop it off in person, but please remember that all ballots must be received by your county elections office by 8 p.m. on May 17th, 2016. Postmarks do not count. If you have questions please call our toll-free hotline at 1-866-ORE-VOTE, or visit our website at www.oregonvotes.gov.

Your official **2016 Primary Election Voters' Pamphlet** provides you with information about candidates who will appear on your ballot.

It includes instructions for marking your ballot, a complete list of federal and state candidates and other information to assist you in the voting process.

The voters' pamphlet has been compiled by the Secretary of State since 1903, when Oregon became one of the first states to provide for the printing and distribution of such a publication.

One copy of the voters' pamphlet is mailed to every household in the state. Additional copies are available at the Secretary of State's office, local post offices, courthouses and all county elections offices.

Information provided in statements or arguments submitted by a candidate, a political party, an assembly of electors or a person supporting or opposing a measure have not been verified for accuracy by the State of Oregon.

Candidates

Oregon statute (ORS 254.155) requires the Secretary of State to complete a random order of the letters of the alphabet to determine the order in which the names of the candidates will appear on the ballot.

The alphabet for the 2016 Primary Election is:

Z, R, B, W, C, D, N, U, G, F, S, I, P, X, J, Y, K, L, V, T, A, O, Q, H, M, E

Candidate statements are divided into two sections—major party candidates or nonpartisan candidates. Major party candidate statements appear before nonpartisan candidate statements and at the primary election major party candidate statements are separated by political party: Democratic Party candidates, Independent Party candidates, Republican Party candidates. Political parties appear alphabetically. Statements are further arranged in the same random order in which the names of the candidates will appear on the ballot.

Candidates pay a fee, or submit signatures in lieu of paying the fee, for space in the voters' pamphlet. The information required by law—pertaining to occupation, occupational background, educational background and prior governmental experience—has been certified as true by each candidate.

Candidate statements are printed as submitted. The state does not correct punctuation, grammar, syntax errors or inaccurate information. The only changes made are attempts to correct spelling errors if the word as originally submitted is not in the dictionary.

You have the right to Vote!

If you are a US citizen, live in Oregon, are 18 years old and have registered to vote.

- **You have the right** to vote even if you are homeless.
- You have the right to vote if you have been convicted of a felony but have been released from custody, even if you are on probation or parole.
- You have the right to vote even if you have a guardian and even if you need help reading or filling out your ballot.
- You have the right to vote or cast your ballot if you are in line by 8pm on Election Day.
- You have the right to know if you are registered to vote.
- You have the right to choose whether or not you want to register as a member of a political party.
- You have the right to use a signature stamp or other mark but first you have to fill out a form. No one can sign for you.
- You have the right to ask for help from elections staff or from a friend or family member. There are some people who cannot help you vote, for example, your boss or a union officer from your job.

- You have the right to a secret vote. You do not have to tell anyone how you voted.
- You have the right to get a "provisional ballot", even if you are told you are not registered to vote.
- **You have the right** to get a new ballot if you make a mistake.
- You have the right to vote for the person you want. You can write in someone else's name if you don't like the choices on your ballot.
- You have the right to vote "yes" or "no" on any issue on your ballot.
- You have the right to leave some choices blank on your ballot. The choices you do mark will still count.
- You have the right to use a voting system for all Federal Elections that makes it equally possible for people with disabilities to vote privately and independently.
- You have the right to know if your ballot, including a "provisional ballot", was accepted for counting.
- You have the right to file a complaint if you think your voting rights have been denied.

Any violations of the identified election laws are subject to penalties ranging from Civil Penalties (Up to \$250 per Violation), Class A Misdemeanors or Class C Felonies.

Summary

Article XI, section 2, of the Oregon Constitution, gives the legal voters of every city power to enact and amend their municipal charter. The City of Damascus currently operates under a 2005 charter. Measure provides that, if majority of voters approve measure, the City of Damascus shall convey all city property to Clackamas County, satisfy all city debts, obligations, liabilities and expenses, distribute excess funds to taxpayers, surrender its charter, disincorporate and cease to exist 61 days after election. City property rights and interests shall vest in Clackamas County; city records shall be deposited in Clackamas County clerk's office; city residents will become residents of unincorporated Clackamas County. Other provisions.

Estimate of Financial Impact

State Cost: None

County Cost: House Bill 3086 (2015), which passed at the same time as the bill referring the disincorporation initiative to the City of Damascus voters (HB 3085 (2015)), requires that if the City votes to disincorporate, after all debts and obligations of the City are settled, the City is to transfer any funds in the city road fund to the Clackamas County road fund to be used for road maintenance on roads within the boundaries of the former City of Damascus. In the 2014-15 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) the road fund balance was just over \$2 million.

The bill further directs that an amount not to exceed \$3.0 million is to be transferred to Clackamas County to be deposited in a separate account to be used to pay for the former employees of the City of Damascus who are transferred to the County pursuant to ORS 236.605, and to provide law enforcement services within the boundaries of the former City of Damascus and other current services expenses.

Finally, after all other obligations are met, Clackamas County is to distribute any remaining funds belonging to the former City of Damascus to ad valorem property taxpayers that owned taxable property as of June 30, 2016, who paid property taxes in full to the City for the property tax year beginning on July 1, 2015. Clackamas County may retain the actual cost of distributing the funds. The 2014-15 CAFR indicates a General Fund balance of \$5.3 million. Costs over and above the not-to-exceed \$3.0 million obligation to Clackamas County, and any other obligations that might be incurred before disincorporation, are not possible to estimate at this time. Therefore the amount of remaining funds, if any, that might ultimately be available to distribute to taxpayers cannot be estimated with any certainty at this time.

Explanation of Estimate of Financial Impact

There is no financial effect on state government expenditures or revenues.

The 2014-15 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) indicates that if the City disincorporates there would be an estimated loss of \$3.0 million in property tax revenue levied by the City of Damascus. Capital assets with a net value of \$1.6 million would be transferred to Clackamas County. Unrestricted and restricted funds totaling \$7.9 million dollars would be transferred or distributed as directed by state law.

The actual amounts transferred may differ from the figures stated above which are based on the City of Damascus CAFR for the fiscal year that ended on June 30, 2015.

Clackamas County will experience a fiscal impact on both the revenue and expenditure sides. If the City of Damascus votes to disincorporate, Clackamas County will be required under ORS 236.610 to transfer the affected City employees to the county payroll for a minimum of one year. The County will also have to provide planning services, code enforcement and law enforcement, all of which will increase County costs. However, some of the new expenses will be offset by increased property tax revenue from newly unincorporated properties, and transfers of funds, and real and personal property from the City of Damascus.

Text of Measure

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) Notwithstanding ORS 221.650, during the period that begins on the 30th day following the date of the election held pursuant to section 2 of this 2015 Act and ends on the 60th day following the date of the election, the City of Damascus shall:

- (a) Expend moneys in the funds of the city to satisfy all debts, obligations, liabilities and expenses of the city, and transfer moneys to Clackamas County, in the manner required under section 1 (2), chapter 637, Oregon Laws 2015 (Enrolled House Bill 3086); and
- (b) Convey, grant, assign and deliver all of the city's real property and tangible and intangible personal property, other than moneys expended or transferred under paragraph (a) of this subsection, by proper conveyance, to Clackamas County for the benefit and use of the county.
- (2) Notwithstanding ORS 221.610 and 221.621, on the 61st day following the date of the election held pursuant to section 2 of this 2015 Act:
- (a) The City of Damascus shall surrender its charter, disincorporate and cease to exist.
- (b)(A) The city shall cease to exist in its corporate capacity without any further or other formal action;
- (B) The city's property rights and interests shall vest in Clackamas County; and
- (C) The auditor, clerk or other keeper of records in the city shall deposit the records of the city in the office of the county clerk.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2015 Act shall be submitted to the people of the City of Damascus for their approval or rejection, by a majority of the voters voting on this 2015 Act, at a special election held on the same date as the next primary election.

Explanatory Statement

The City of Damascus currently operates under a 2005 charter. Article XI, section 2, of the Oregon Constitution, gives the legal voters of every city the power to enact and amend their municipal charter. If this measure is approved by the voters, 30 days after the election the City of Damascus will be required to satisfy all debts, obligations, liabilities and expenses of the city, transfer city funds in the manner provided by House Bill 3086 (2015), and convey all of the city's other property to Clackamas County. On the 61st day following the election if Measure 93 is approved, the City of Damascus will be required to surrender its charter, disincorporate and cease to exist. The city's property rights and interests will vest in Clackamas County. And the city's records must be deposited in the office of the Clackamas County Clerk, City residents will become residents of unincorporated Clackamas County. If Measure 93 is approved, under HB 3086 the payments to be made by the city before disincorporation include debt service payments, lease obligations, financing arrangements and obligations relating to employment of city employees. The transfers include the transfer of moneys in the city road fund to the county road fund for expenditure by the county within the territory of the former city. In addition, there would be a transfer of up to \$3 million for expenses related to the employment by the county of former city employees, contracted law enforcement services and other servicerelated and administrative expenses. Finally, House Bill 3086 specifies that any remaining funds in excess of the amounts necessary for these payments, transfers and expenditures are to be deposited in a separate account for distribution by the county to former city taxpayers. Each person that owned taxable property in the city as of June 30, 2016, for which city property taxes were paid in full, will receive a proportional amount of the total to be distributed. Any amount of these distributions that remains unclaimed on January 1, 2019, will be transferred to the county general fund.

Legislative Argument in Support

The 2015 Oregon Legislative Assembly approved Ballot Measure 93 to allow residents of the City of Damascus to vote on whether or not to disincorporate their city and rejoin unincorporated Clackamas County.

More than a decade after incorporation, and six years after the statutory deadline, Damascus has not adopted a comprehensive plan. This means the city lacks authority to establish zones or approve development projects by property owners, residents and businesses. Additionally, due to the absence of a comprehensive plan and the presence of certain restrictions in the city charter, Damascus property owners are taxed yet the revenue cannot be spent on capital projects or critical services.

Some property owners have begun the process of withdrawing their properties from the city; others have expressed the desire to do so but are legally unable to. Still others hope that a comprehensive plan will be adopted, thus fully empowering the city. At present, however, there is no working solution to these ongoing problems on the horizon.

The legislature determined that the situation can best be addressed by allowing the citizens to decide either to disincorporate or to continue trying to develop a fully functioning city. A "yes" vote on Measure 93 disincorporates the city and returns the territory to Clackamas County's jurisdiction. In addition, a "yes" vote directs the city to pay all outstanding obligations, transfer a limited amount of funds to Clackamas County for the continuation of services, and distribute any excess city funds to Damascus property taxpayers.

Given the numerous unsuccessful attempts to create a fully functioning city to date, and the restrictions in the city charter that make such a result unlikely in the future, the Oregon Legislative Assembly recommends a "yes" vote on Ballot Measure 93.

Argument in Favor

Disincorporate Damascus: Vote YES on Measure 93

In November 2013, 64% of Damascus citizens voted to Disincorporate the city. We were told poorly written statutes meant the majority did not win.

The Oregon Court of Appeals said only the Oregon Legislature could fix the faulty language. We went to the Legislature asking for legislation confirming a **simple majority voting requirement**, and to **return excess city funds** to taxpayers. The bills passed almost unanimously.

Measure 93 resulted from 2 1/2 years of effort:

"Majority YES vote disincorporates City of Damascus; property to Clackamas County, net assets to taxpayers"

M-93 means the people can vote on their community's future, and this time, the *Majority Wins!* 'YES' on M-93 will end the dysfunction and waste, ends paying city taxes, and means each Damascus property owner will receive a refund conservatively estimated at 75-85% of one year's city taxes.

Since the 2013 vote, we have seen a **Damascus city council file lawsuits against our citizens**, continued conflict, **five comprehensive plans fail by ever-increasing margins**, no indications of any improvement, and **another \$7.7 million** of your tax dollars **wasted**.

On March 7, 2016, four Damascus council members directed the city attorney to research ways to prevent certain taxpayers and citizens from voting in the M-93 election, clearly showing the corruption and dysfunction Damascus city government has become infamous for. This cannot be allowed. It is wrong. It is unethical. It is corrupt. It must end. NOW.

The last 12 years have given us experience into what being a city means, **most of it bad**. We know the issues, we know the truth, and we want our peaceful community back.

The 2013 vote clearly showed people wanted to end the city. We had the <u>right</u> to incorporate a city, and we have the <u>right</u> to disincorporate that city.

We have the right to decide OUR future.

Please join us in Voting 'YES' on Measure 93.

Argument in Opposition

Reasons for Voting "NO" on Measure 93

Keep the Future of Damascus in Our Hands. We became a City 12 years ago to avoid being annexed into Happy Valley and Gresham, to have freedom to govern ourselves, with better protection of our natural resources and lower density. Now we have proof that this was the right decision. In January Happy Valley announced the East Happy Valley Comprehensive Plan that over the next 10 years would annex lands 1 mile farther east, up to Damascus shopping center. Should Damascus disincorporate, Happy Valley's vision for our city includes higher density (like the 600 more homes on Scouter's Mt), more commercial zoning, and less protection of our River, streams, buttes, farm lands and inspiring vistas.

What Happy Valley doesn't annex Clackamas County will urbanize under its Plan with more commerce and higher density. It needs open land and does not share our values.

<u>Taxes</u>. What do we get for our taxes? Better police protection, emergency planning, utility rates, traffic controls, parks, and planning—on density, zoning, streets, water and sewers. Damascus City Council has twice cut our tax rate, by a total of 15%. With annexation Happy Valley will tax us, ending our local control.

<u>Transportation</u>. Road repair, congestion and mass transit will be controlled by Happy Valley and Clackamas County, not by us.

<u>Marijuana</u>. This November <u>Damascus will vote</u> on our own regulations. Upon disincorporation we will not have a vote, which will subject us to less stringent regulations for our farms and neighborhoods.

<u>City Charter</u>. This November <u>Damascus will vote</u> on a new, workable charter that will remove roadblocks to creating a functioning, beautiful city.

The State Legislature and Governor created HB 3085 to force this vote on us. If the same effort was put toward passing a comprehensive plan Damascus would already be a functioning city.

What is a facility voting assistance team?

A **congregate living facility** may form a Facility Assistance Team to assist voters living in their facility.

Teams must be made up of **two registered voters** who are not members of the same political party.

Registering to Vote

To vote in Oregon you need to be registered in the county where you reside.

You can register if you can answer yes to these three questions:

- → Are you a resident of Oregon?
- → Are you a US citizen?
- → Are you at least 17 years of age?

If you are 17 years of age, you will not receive a ballot until an election occurs on or after your 18th birthday.

How to register

You can register to vote online at www.oregonvotes.gov or you can get a voter registration card at any of the following places:

- \rightarrow in this voters' pamphlet
- → any county elections office
- → the Secretary of State's Office
- → some state agencies such as the Division of Motor Vehicles
- a voter registration drive

You can fill the card out in person or send it in by US mail.

You can also print out a registration card online at: www.oregonvotes.gov.

To vote in the **May 17, 2016**, Primary Election, your completed voter registration card must be either:

- → postmarked by Tuesday, April 26, 2016
- → delivered to a county elections office by Tuesday, April 26, 2016 or
- delivered to any voter registration agency (e.g., DMV) by Tuesday, April 26, 2016.

If you register to vote online, your registration must be submitted by 11:59pm on Tuesday, **April 26, 2016**.

What information is required to register?

To complete your registration you will provide your:

- → Full legal name
- → Home address
- → Date of birth
- → Signature
- → Valid identification

What are the identification requirements?

 If you have a current, valid Driver's License, Permit or ID number issued by the State of Oregon Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV), you must provide it in the boxes on the card.

A suspended Driver's License is still valid; a revoked Driver's License is NOT valid.

- If you do not have a current, valid Driver's License, Permit
 or ID number issued by the State of Oregon Division of
 Motor Vehicles, you must affirm this on the card by marking
 the appropriate circle and you must then provide the last
 four digits of your Social Security Number.
- If you do not have a Social Security number, you must affirm this on the card by marking the circle in indicating you do not have a valid Driver's License or Social Security number.
- 4. If you do not have a Driver's License, Permit, ID number, or a Social Security number, and you are registering by mail, you must provide a copy of one of the following which shows the voter's name and current address:
 - → valid photo identification
 - → a paycheck stub
 - → a utility bill
 - → a bank statement
 - → a government document
 - proof of eligibility under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA) or the Voting Accessibility for the Elderly and Handicapped Act (VAEH)

If you do not provide valid identification, you will not be eligible to vote for Federal races. You will, however, still be eligible to vote for state and local contests.

Updating your voter registration

Once you have registered, you are responsible for keeping your information up to date. You can do this online at www.oregonvotes.gov or by completing and returning a voter registration card with the new information. You should update your registration if you do any of the following:

- → change your home address
- → change your mailing address
- → change your name
- → change your signature
- → want to change or select a political party
- → will be away from home on election day

If you notify your county elections office of your change of residence address after **May 12, 2016**, you must request that a ballot be mailed to you or go to your county elections office to get your ballot.

Vote by Mail Frequently Asked Questions

As a voter, what do I have to do?

Your ballot packet will automatically be mailed to you between **April 27** and **May 3, 2016**. Inside the packet you will find the ballot, a secrecy envelope and a return envelope. Once you vote the ballot, place it in the secrecy envelope and seal it in the pre-addressed return envelope. Be sure you sign the return envelope on the appropriate line. After that just return the ballot either by mail or at a designated dropsite.

What if I am uncomfortable voting my ballot at home?

There are privacy booths available for you to cast your ballot at your county elections office and there may be others at dropsite locations elsewhere in your county. For further information, call your county elections official.

What if my ballot doesn't come?

If you are registered to vote and have not received your ballot by **May 6**, call your county elections office. They will check that your voter registration is current. If it is, they will mail you a replacement ballot. You can also check the status of your ballot at My Vote at www.oregonvotes.gov.

What if I have moved and have not updated my registration?

If you were registered to vote by **April 26** but now have a different address, call your county elections office for instructions on how to update your registration and receive a ballot.

Do I have to return my ballot by mail?

You have the choice of mailing your ballot or returning it to any county elections office or any designated official dropsite in the state. You can find your nearest dropsite along with a map of how to get there by going to www.oregonvotes.gov or you may contact your county elections office.

How much postage is required to mail the ballot back?

Your voted ballot can usually be returned using a single 47¢ first-class stamp. In those instances where additional postage is necessary, it will be clearly indicated on the ballot materials.

When must the voted ballot be returned?

Your voted ballot must be received in any county elections office or designated dropsite by 8pm, Tuesday, **May 17, 2016**. Postmarks do not count! All county elections offices are open election day from 7am to 8pm.

How do I know if my ballot is received?

You can track the status of your ballot by going online to: My Vote at www.oregonvotes.gov or you can call your county elections office and ask if they received your ballot. A record is kept showing each voter whose ballot has been returned.

Can anyone find out how I've voted once I mail my ballot?

No. All ballots are separated from the return envelope before the ballots are inspected. This process ensures confidentiality.

What if I forget to sign the return envelope?

Your elections office will contact you, if possible, to come to the elections office to sign it.

Can the public watch the election process?

All steps of the process are open to observation by the public. Contact your county elections official to make arrangements.

When will election results be known?

Initial results are released at 8pm election night and will continue to be updated through election night until all ballots have been counted. Final certified results will be available 30 days after the election.

Replacement Ballot Information

Important! If your ballot is lost, destroyed, damaged or you make a mistake in marking your ballot, you may call your county elections office and request a replacement ballot. One will be mailed to you as long as you request it by May 12. After that, you may pick it up at the elections office. If you have already mailed your original ballot before you realize you made a mistake, you have cast your vote and will not be eligible for a replacement ballot.

Provisional Ballot Information

You will be issued a provisional ballot if:

- → there is a question about your eligibility as a voter (for example, there is no evidence on file that you are an active or inactive voter in Oregon)
- → you need to vote at a county elections office in a county other than the one you live in

In order to obtain a provisional ballot, you need to fill out a Provisional Ballot Request Form in person at the county elections office.

Your provisional ballot will not be counted until it is determined that you are eligible to vote.

After you have voted the ballot, you can call **1-866-ORE-VOTE** (1-866-673-8683) or the county elections office in which you voted to find out if your ballot was counted. If your ballot was not counted, you can also find out the reason it was not counted.

If it is determined that you are ineligible to vote in this election, the completed Provisional Ballot Request Form will serve as your voter registration for future elections.

How to File a Complaint

Any registered voter may file a written complaint with the Secretary of State alleging that a violation of an election law or rule adopted by the Secretary of State has occurred. The complaint should state the reason for believing that the violation occurred and provide evidence relating to it. The complaint must be signed by the elector; anonymous complaints will not be accepted. The complaint should be mailed to, or filed at:
